Congratulations to Mrs Dangerfield who will be joining our lunchtime supervising team in January 2024.

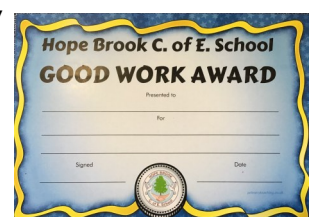


Good Work Awards
